to the puzzles many philosophers have argued that free will is
incompatible with determinism and many have also argued that it is
incompatible with indeterminism so is free will simply an
incoherent concept talbott argues that the best way out of this
quagmire requires that we come to appreciate why certain
conditions essential to our emergence as free moral agents

conditions such as indeterminism ignorance and a context of ambiguity and misperception are themselves obstacles to a fully realized freedom for a fully realized freedom requires that as minimally rational individuals we have learned some important lessons for ourselves and once these lessons have been learned some of our freest choices may be such that we could not have chosen otherwise because so choosing would then seem to us utterly unthinkable and irrational

are humans free or are we determined by our genes and the world around us the question of freedom is not only one of philosophy s greatest conundrums but also one of the most fundamental questions of human existence it s particularly pressing in societies like ours where our core institutions of law ethics and religion are built around the belief in individual freedom can one still affirm human freedom in an age of science and if free will doesn t exist does it make sense to act as though it does these are the issues that are presented probed and debated in the following chapters a dozen experts specialists in medicine psychology ethics theology and philosophy grapple with the multiple and often profound challenges presented by today s brain science after examining the arguments against traditional notions of free will several of the authors champion the idea of a chastened but robust free will for today one that allows us still to affirm the value of first person experience

world's stage that is only after the conceptual issues are settled can the question of how things actually stand be answered this work will be an important reassessment of free will not just because of the author's final conclusion but because of the issue illuminating path he takes to get there
